	Involvement with MDT and several bespoke opportunities are available. You can discuss this locally with educator. Fast paced hospital based Acute Orthopedics. One 23 bedded ward dealing with fractured femurs and one trauma ward treating a wide range of upper and lower limb orthopedic patients. Age range of patients 18+. Patients are seen pre and post-surgery.
Learning Opportunities on Placement	Provision of equipment to support early hospital discharge. Referral for ongoing rehabilitation to the local community hospitals, Residential Rehabilitation units and Community Integrated Therapy teams. Wide variety of visits, these can include: - Burnley Elective orthopaedics including attendance at the Hip and Knee school. Observation of surgery can be arranged. Home First, Falls Car, Community Integrated Therapy teams, Residential Rehabilitation units, Hand Therapy/ Fracture bracing.
Strengths of Placement	 Integrated Therapy team Daily board rounds Close working within the whole team. Patients are assessed, treatment planned and undertaken for discharge. Involvement with a wide range of services such as the Trauma team, Home First, Intensive Home Support Service, Social Services. Observation of surgery may be possible.
Limitations of Placement	 Fast paced department with a rapid throughput of a large number of patients. Patients are treated in the early stages of recovery with plans made for discharge home or onward to rehabilitation. Unable to follow up patients once they are discharged from hospital or those who go onto rehabilitation Processes and procedures are different across Blackburn with Darwen, East Lancashire and for the out of area patients; liaison is required with a wide variety of staff across the areas.
Learning Outcomes Expected from Placement	Outcomes based on the University objectives will be agreed with between the student and educator on arrival. These will be reviewed throughout the placement.
