Placement Experience Offered

Ward 16 (Burnley General Hospital) provides Occupational Therapy to complex patients who have been transferred from Royal Blackburn Hospital. Ward 19 is a rehab ward for patients who have been transferred from the acute wards at Blackburn hospital for rehabilitation input prior to discharge.

The aim is to provide OT holistic assessments and interventions for patients with complex needs. This placement will enable students to enhance their understanding and skills when considering a variety of co-morbidities and patients' needs.
