## During your placement

### Placement Experience Offered

Our service is actually called IDSTT (Integrated discharge service therapy team), Home First is a pathway not a team, we carry out Home First visits and early supportive follow up visits.

The Home first pathway is a discharge to assess model (D2A), it is a rapid discharge and on the visit we will look at the patient's mobility, functional ability and care needs in their own environment, providing crisis care to support over 3 days at home, this is followed up by social services on day 3 regarding any further care needs. We also provide equipment as required, delivered the same day and can request follow-up visit from the ICAT – OT. We also can refer on to the Integrated Therapy Team for further assessment in the community and to external agencies such as Age UK and memory matters.

the opportunity to assess Patients with various medical and complex needs  
liaise with family  
work alongside MDT
