Individual Placement Description

<p>Post: FY1 Vascular Surgery</p>
<p>The department:</p> <p>This placement is in Regional Vascular Centre. At present, the Vascular Surgery team consists of 5 consultants, 2 senior clinical fellows, ST doctors, 2 CT doctors, 1 FY2 and 3 FY1 doctors, 1 advanced nurse practitioner and specialist vascular nurses.</p>
<p>Main duties of the post:</p> <p>There are excellent opportunities to develop further your skills in the management of elective and emergency vascular surgery along with general surgery on call. The FY1 doctor is responsible with other staff for the ward care of patients and the maintenance of the patient's medical record. On-call work on the wards and Surgical Triage Unit (STU) allows familiarization with common acute surgical presentations and their management. FY1s are expected to present patients at the weekly MDT meeting. There are opportunities to attend OP clinics and theatres on regular basis. Please see below for the suggested learning objectives for this post which have been mapped to the curriculum.</p>
