### Individual Placement Description

<p><b>Post:</b> FY2 Vascular Surgery</p>
<p><b>The department:</b> The Vascular Surgery team consists of 5 consultants, 3 senior clinical fellows, ST doctor, 1 CT doctor, 1 FY2 and 3 FY1 doctors and specialist vascular nurses.</p>
<p><b>Main duties of the post:</b> The FY2 doctor is responsible with other staff for the ward care of patients and the maintenance of the patient's medical record. They will supervise and assist the FY1 doctors with the provision of care of in-patients. They will also liaise with interventional radiology and other specialties. FY2s are expected to attend the weekly MDT meeting. There are ample opportunities to attend OP clinics and theatres on a regular basis. Please see below for the suggested learning objectives for this post which have been mapped to the curriculum.</p> <p>On-call work on the wards and Surgical Triage Unit (STU) allows familiarization with common acute surgical presentations and their management. FY2 doctors are expected to see and assess patients presenting to STU and hot clinic, and assist in theatre.</p>

- Understand the roles of the multidisciplinary team and works as part of that team
